USING YOUR CELL PHONE ABROAD

Before You Travel

Call Your Cell Phone Provider

- Find out if your phone works abroad
- Research cell phone provider's international rates
- Sign up for international plan if needed

Save Your International Contact Numbers

- Program hotel, restaurant, guide, and any other numbers into your phone ahead of time
- Put the + sign before the country code for easy dialing

During Your Trip

If you don't have an international plan...

- Turn off your cellular data or put your phone in airplane mode to avoid accidental data usage

Track your data usage

- Upon arrival, reset cellular data usage to track
- Or you can download My Data Manager app

Connect to Wi-Fi

- Even with a data plan, use Wi-Fi when possible
- Many restaurants and cafes offer free Wi-Fi to patrons

Use common sense when connected to public Wi-Fi networks that aren't secure. Avoid logging into your bank, credit card, or other personal accounts.

After the Trip

Cancel any international plans

- Call your service provider and cancel any international plans you added to your phone

Skype

- Internet-based voice and video calling

What's App

- Internet-based messaging

FaceTime

- Internet-based video calling for iOS devices

iMessage

- Internet-based text messaging for iOS devices

Note: If you have an iPhone and are using cellular data to text, you will need to turn off your iMessaging when you are not connected to Wi-Fi
